DIARY OR LOG-BOOK.

The managers are held responsible by the Department for the conduct of their schools, for their maintenance in efficiency, and for the provision of all needful furniture, books, and apparatus, and in particular of—

- (a) Suitable Registers;
- (b) A Portfolio to contain Official Letters;
- (c) A Diary or Log-Book;
- (d) A Cash Book;
- (e) The Code and Revised Instructions for each year;
- (f) A Book for Recording Minutes of Managers' Meetings.

The Log-Book must be stoutly bound. * * * It must be kept by the principal teacher, who is required to enter in it from time to time such events as the introduction of new books, apparatus, or courses of instruction, any plan of lessons approved by the Inspector, the visits of managers, absence, illness, or failure of duty on the part of any of the school staff, or any special circumstances affecting the school, that may, for the sake of future reference or for any other reason, deserve to be recorded.

No reflections or opinions of a general character are to be entered in the Log-Book.—(Art. 8.)

The summary of any Report made by the Inspector, and any remarks made upon it by the Department, must, as soon as communicated to the managers be copied verbatim into the Log-Book and signed by the correspondent of the managers.—(Art. 24.)

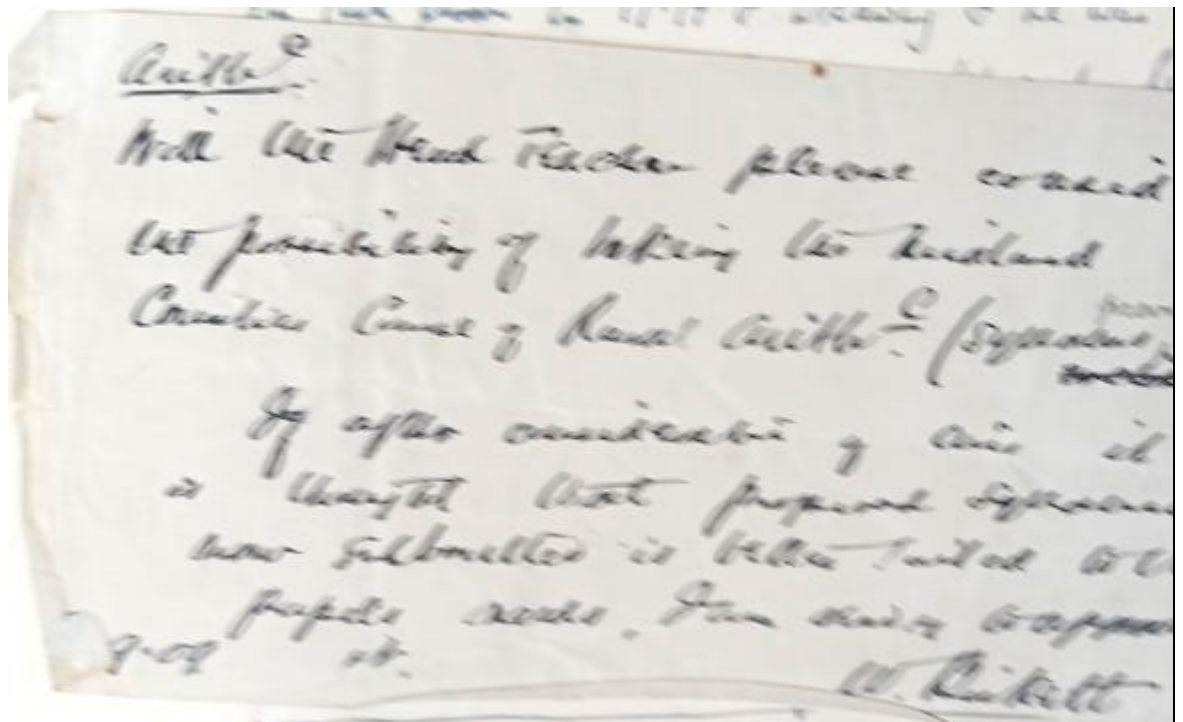
