# Preparing your Child for School



Here are some ideas of things you can do to prepare your child for starting school!

## Develop their independence by supporting them to-

- Get dressed independently
- Put on their socks and shoes correctly
- Zip up their coat
- Use a knife and fork correctly
- Open containers & packets
- Try different healthy food
- Use the toilet independently



## Develop their communication & language skills-

- Support their social skills
- Introduce new vocabulary
- Encourage them to listen and respond to instructions
- Practise sharing and taking turns
- Develop their understanding of rhyming and think about initial sounds in words
- Singing songs– it is important for children to sing nursery rhymes!



## Reading-

- We want every child to love books and enjoy reading. Please share lots of stories with your child and encourage them to join in when they can!
- Read fairytales together– the children will need to know fairytales so please give them a little head start by allowing them to become familiar with these

## Writing-

- Support your child to recognise and attempt to write their name
- Teach your child how to hold a pencil correctly
- Develop their fine motor skills– playdough, threading, using tweezers and objects



## Maths-

- Counting verbally from 0-10
- Number recognition– visually recognising numbers to 10 in a random order.
