

## Welton School Logbook: 1955 – 1982

Sept 6 <sup>th</sup> 1955	<p>Sept 6. This morning the primary school reopened after the summer holidays. The managers have agreed to the temporary admission of children from the new housing estate at Dunholme, and 8 were admitted this morning, in addition to 5 infants from welton, making a total of 105 on the register.</p> <p>Because of the lack of accommodation at the secondary modern department the juniors have occupied the H.O.R.S.A. classroom have been transferred to the main building.</p> <p>The 4 classes are now arranged as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 26 upper juniors, age 9 and 10, in the large classroom. Class teacher: the headmaster</li> <li>2. 26 lower juniors, age 8 and 9, also in the large classroom. Class teacher: Mr R. Fletcher (Q.A)</li> <li>3. 27 lower juniors, age 7 and 8, in the middle classroom. Class teacher: Miss P.A. Roberts (Q.A)</li> <li>4. 26 infants in the infant's classroom. Class teacher: Miss N. Fox</li> </ol> <p>The percentage attendance this morning was 97%</p> <p>Mid-day meals for the juniors continue to be served at the secondary department; 65 children attended this morning.</p>
Sept 7 <sup>th</sup>	<p>To facilitate the serving of mid-day meals morning school ends at 11:55, and the afternoon session begins at 1:25</p> <p>A new time-table for each class has been constructed and was adopted today. 1 child was admitted from Dunholme.</p>
Sept 13 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Mr R. Fletcher was absent this afternoon he was interviewed at Wainfleet for the post of headmaster of the Cofe School there admitted 1 child from Dunholme.</p>
Sept 14 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Mr R.A. Hesh, school attendance officer, visited this afternoon.</p>
Sept 19 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Miss Roberts was absent today owing to illness.</p> <p>Admitted 2 children from Dunholme. Roll now equals 109.</p>
Sept 20 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Miss Roberts resumed duty this morning.</p>
Sept 29 <sup>th</sup>	<p>We held our Harvest thanksgiving service in the main classroom this afternoon. The vicar of Welton, the Rev E.C. Blake, gave an appropriate address. The upper junior girls decorated the room with corn and flowers, and arranged the numerous gifts of fruit, vegetables, eggs and provisions on a large central table. After the service these gifts were taken to the city and county home for girls, in Lincoln.</p>
Sept 30 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Attendances since the beginning of term has been remarkably good, averaging 97%.</p>
Oct 14 <sup>th</sup>	<p>School closed for the half-term holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on Thursday, 20th Oct.</p>
Oct 20 <sup>th</sup>	<p>School re-opened this morning.</p>
Oct 27 <sup>th</sup> 1955	<p>Two students from the training college, Lincoln, spent the day with Miss Fox in the infants classroom, preparing for a period of teaching practice which begins on 7th November.</p>
Nov 3 <sup>rd</sup>	<p>The school attendance officer visited school this afternoon. No irregular attenders were reported.</p>
Nov 7 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Admitted 2 children this morning. Roll = 111.</p> <p>Two students, Miss Sharp and Miss Kirk, from the Lincoln training college, commenced a fortnight's teaching practice with the infants class.</p>
Nov 17 <sup>th</sup>	<p>The school attendance officer, Mr R.A. Hesh, called this afternoon.</p>
Nov 23 <sup>rd</sup>	<p>In connection with the admission of children to secondary schools in 1956, the preliminary intelligence fest was held this morning, during the first period of secular instruction. 10 children (5 boys and 5 girls) in the normal age group -</p>

	children born between 1st September, 1944 and 31st August 1945 - were examined.
Dec 1 <sup>st</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Dec 22 <sup>nd</sup> 1955	School closed this afternoon for the Christmas holiday. It will reopen on Tuesday, 10th Jan.
1956 Jan 10 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning. Atrocious weather - deep snow, icy winds and blocked roads were responsible for the very poor attendance - only 47%. Concern over the provisions of mid-day meals was felt when the electricity supply failed, and the closure of the school was contemplated. However, we decided to supply emergency meals at the school house for the 10 children who could not go home, and school remained open, and the registers were marked. Fewer children (only 41%) attended in the afternoon
Jan 11 <sup>th</sup>	Severe weather continued and many roads were still blocked by snow. Attendance this morning was 55%. Electricity not yet restored. Emergency meals provided for 23 children. Afternoon school commenced at 1:15 and closed at 3:15pm
Jan 12 <sup>th</sup>	Conditions slowly improving. Attendance 74%. Electricity restored. Normal meals provided at the canteen for 42 children. Afternoon school as yesterday.
Jan 13 <sup>th</sup>	Attendance this morning was 82%. Afternoon school as yesterday.
Jan 16 <sup>th</sup>	Normal attendance today.
Jan 25 <sup>th</sup>	Written examination for admission to secondary schools. School closed, except for the 5 children who qualified to take the examination. The head mistress of Dunholme Cofe school was the invigilator here. The headmaster conducted the examination at Hackthorn Cofe school.
Jan 26 <sup>th</sup>	Miss Roberts absent owing to illness. The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Jan 27 <sup>th</sup>	Miss Roberts resumed duty today.
Feb 6 <sup>th</sup>	Mr Fletcher still absent.
Feb 10 <sup>th</sup>	School closed this afternoon for the half term holiday. It will re-open on Wednesday 15th February.
Feb 11 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer visited school this afternoon.
Feb 15 <sup>th</sup>	School re-assembled this morning. Ash Wednesday. Immediately after registration the junior classes attended church for the ash wednesday service conducted by the vicar, the Rev E.C. Blake. The secondary modern department also attended at the same time. Mr Fletcher resumed duty this morning. Attendance is now back to normal although bitterly cold weather continues.
March 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Police sergeant Dennison of the Gainsborough division visited this afternoon and gave road safety talks to the junior and infant classes.
March 9 <sup>th</sup>	Excellent attendances have been maintained throughout the week, the average being 97.5%.
March 12 <sup>th</sup>	Miss K.M. Spence, domestic ... organiser, called this afternoon, and saw the junior girl's needlework.
March 26 <sup>th</sup>	Mr Fletcher absent this afternoon. He was interviewed at Waddingham for the post of headmaster of the primary school there.
March 28 <sup>th</sup>	School closed this afternoon for the Easter holiday. It will re-open on 16th April.
April 16 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning. 4 infants and 2 juniors were admitted (2 infants were from the Dunholme housing estate). The classes for this term are arranged as follows: 32 in the infants class with Miss N. Fox 29 in the lower junior B. class with Miss P. Roberts 32 in the lower junior A. class with Mr R. Fletcher 34 in the upper junior class with the headmaster

	Only 2 children, who are still away from home, are absent today.
April 25 <sup>th</sup>	16 junior children, with Mr Fletcher, visited the Usher art gallery in Lincoln this afternoon to see the exhibition of children's art.
April 26 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
May 3 <sup>rd</sup>	In connection with the admission of children to secondary schools, Andrew Marsden and Mark Jaremla were interviewed by the local panel this afternoon at the De Aston school, Market Rasen.
May 9 <sup>th</sup>	Nurse Wilkinson, health visitor, called this afternoon.
May 11 <sup>th</sup> 1956	Ascension day. School attended church this morning at 9:15 for a special ascension day service conducted by the Vicar Canon E.W. Herbert.
May 17 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
May 18 <sup>th</sup>	School closed for the Whitsun holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on 28th May.
May 28 <sup>th</sup>	Re-opened school this morning. Attendance 100%.
May 29 <sup>th</sup>	In connection with the admission of children to secondary schools, Vivien Capes attended the county offices for interview this afternoon.
May 31 <sup>st</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon. Attendance is excellent.
June 11 <sup>th</sup>	The L.E.A's list of children to be admitted to secondary grammar schools next September was published this morning. Andrew Marsden and Mark Jaremla will attend the De Aston school, Market Rasen, and Vivien Capes one of the girl's grammar schools in Lincoln. St. Barnabas day. School attended church this morning at 9:15.
June 27 <sup>th</sup>	We held our school sports this evening in a field kindly lent by Mr B. Neave. Mr J.A. Wikstead, deputy director of education presented the "Rainthorpe" cup to the captains of Brinkhall house- the champions of the evening- and other awards. It was a delightfully fine evening and a large number of parents and friends witnessed a very enjoyable programme.
June 29 <sup>th</sup>	St Peter's day. School attended church this morning at 9:15. Attendance during the month has been exceptionally good.
July 11 <sup>th</sup>	School competed in the inter-schools sports at Saxilby this morning. Our team were taken by Mr Fletcher and Miss Roberts.
July 13 <sup>th</sup>	The Rev J.E.Ballister, Vicar of Middle Rasen, and Diocesan inspector, conducted the inspection of religious knowledge this morning, after service in church at 9:15. The afternoon was taken as holiday.
July 14 <sup>th</sup>	The following report has been received from the Diocesan inspector following his inspection on 13th July: It was a great pleasure to me to visit this school for the first time and to see the excellent work done in it. The .... , the headmaster, the staff are all to be congratulated on the spirit, the progress and the attainment in this school. The day began with a service in the parish church, and it was a real act of worship. I was greatly impressed by the demeanor and evident devotion of the children. I inspected all the four classes and have nothing but praise for all I saw and heard. In each case the syllabus had been thoroughly and carefully taught by the teachers, and assimilated by the children who answered my questions quickly and intelligently. Their writing work was equally good. It is clear that this school will go from strength to strength. Next year the certificate of religious knowledge will be taken. This is a fine school of which the parish may be justly proud. J.E Ballister - Diocesan inspector.
July 20 <sup>th</sup>	School closed for the summer holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on Tuesday 4th September.
Sept 4 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning when 13 infants were admitted. As suggested in the L.E.A's circular No. 652 children who will attain their 5th birthday before the commencement of the next spring term were admitted, and 4 of our new infants

	<p>are in this age-group. Their admissions will mean that virtually there will be no new infants in January.</p> <p>The total number of children on roll is 130.</p> <p>The new classes are arranged as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 36 upper juniors (ages 9 and 10) in the large classroom. Class teacher: the headmaster.</li> <li>2. 29 lower juniors (group A, ages 8 and 9) also in the large classroom. Mr R. Fletcher.</li> <li>3. 32 lower juniors (group B) and infants (group A) in the middle classroom. Miss P.A. Roberts.</li> <li>4. 33 infants in the infant classroom. Class teacher: Miss N. Fox.</li> </ol> <p>The percentage attendance this morning was 95%.</p> <p>Mid-day meals for our children continue to be served at the secondary modern school, and 82 attended there this morning. From today the cost per meal is 10d.</p>
Sept 5 <sup>th</sup>	The Vicar, Canon E.W. Herbert conducted morning assembly this morning. He has elected to do this each Wednesday and Friday and to take religious instruction immediately afterwards.
Sept 6 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Sept 20 <sup>th</sup>	The Director of education Mr. Y.F. Birkuck visited school for a few minutes this afternoon. Three additional wash basins have been installed in the infants classroom. Hot water is supplied to each from an electrically controlled geysers.
Sept 28 <sup>th</sup>	The children's Harvest festival was held in church this morning. Many gifts of fruit, vegetables and provisions were taken. The service was conducted by the vicar. Graham Thomas - Class 1 - read the lesson.
Sept 29 <sup>th</sup>	Today we held a "Bring and buy" jumble sale which produced £32 for the school fund.
Oct 2 <sup>nd</sup> 1956	By arrangement with the county library library books were exchanged this morning.
Oct 9 <sup>th</sup>	Two cases of chicken-pox were verified today. The school medical officer of health has been notified on form sms 31.
Oct 12 <sup>th</sup>	During the week 10 cases of chicken-pox have been reported. They are chiefly amongst the infants.
Oct 19 <sup>th</sup>	Attendance for the week has been down to 82%. About half the infants class are absent owing to chicken-pox.
Oct 25 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Oct 31 <sup>st</sup>	School closed for the half-term holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on Thursday, Nov 8th. An additional day has been granted to allow the Headmaster and staff to attend the enthronement of the Rt. Rev. Kenneth Riches as Bishop of Lincoln on 7th November.
Nov 8 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning. Miss Roberts is absent owing to illness. Several children are away suffering from chicken-pox. Attendance = 87%
Nov 12 <sup>th</sup>	Miss Roberts returned to duty this morning.
Nov 13 <sup>th</sup>	Dr. G. Hagan conducted the annual medical inspection today.
Nov 20 <sup>th</sup>	In response to an appeal by the Lord mayor of London for funds to assist Hungarian refugees (due to Russian aggression) the scholars and staff forwarded £7.2
Nov 21 <sup>st</sup>	In connection with the admission of children to secondary schools in 1957 the preliminary intelligence test was held this morning during the first period of secular instruction. 19 children took the test.
Nov 30 <sup>th</sup>	St. Andrew's day. School attended church for a service at 9:15 am conducted by the vicar Canon E.W. Herbert.

	Attendances are practically back to normal although odd cases of chicken-pox are being reported.
Dec 6 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Dec 11 <sup>th</sup>	The mobile phone unit visited school this afternoon when selected films were shown to the infants, lower juniors, and to the upper juniors.
Dec 18 <sup>th</sup>	Thick fog descended during the early afternoon. Play-time was cancelled and the children were dismissed at 3:30 pm.
Dec 20 <sup>th</sup> 1956	School closed for the Christmas holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on Tuesday 8th January.
Jan 5 <sup>th</sup> 1957	The new title of the school is now officially recognised by the local education authority, and by the ministry of education. Forthwith the school is to be known as Welton St. Mary's Church of England Primary School.
Jan 8 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning. 3 children including 2 infants, were admitted making a total of 128 on the register. Attendance was 95%.
Jan 10 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
Jan 14 <sup>th</sup>	Books loaned by the county library were changed this morning.
Jan 21 <sup>st</sup>	Miss Bloomfield and Miss Erley, the education committee's organisers for primary schools visited school this morning.
Jan 23 <sup>rd</sup>	The written examination of admission to secondary schools was held today. School closed except for the 14 children who qualified to take the examination. The headmistress of Dunholme C of E school was the invigilator here, the headmaster conducting the examination at Hackthorn C of E school.
Jan 28 <sup>th</sup>	Commencing today, school begins at 9:15 and the afternoon session at 1:15. This new arrangement has been made because of the late arrival of buses conveying long distance children.
Jan 31 <sup>st</sup>	The attendance throughout the month has been exceptionally good for this time of year, averaging 94%.
Feb 12 <sup>th</sup>	The school attendance officer Mr Y.J Curtis called this afternoon.
Feb 27 <sup>th</sup>	Hearing tests were given to the children today by L.E.A's audiometrician.
Feb 28 <sup>th</sup>	School closed this afternoon for the half-term break.
March 5 <sup>th</sup>	School re-opened this morning.
March 6 <sup>th</sup>	Ash Wednesday. School assembled at church at 9:15 this morning for the ash Wednesday service conducted by the Vicar Canon E.W Herbert.
March 11 <sup>th</sup>	Sgt Dennison of the Lincolnshire police force, stationed at Gainsborough, visited school this afternoon and conducted a road safety quiz in connection with the local road safety campaign. The upper juniors thoroughly enjoyed the quiz and greatly benefited therefore.
March 12 <sup>th</sup>	Mr Y.J Curtis, school attendance officer, called this afternoon. Attendance continues to be very good. No irregular attendances were reported.
March 25 <sup>th</sup> 1957	Lady day. School assembled at church this morning at 10:30 for a special children's service conducted by the vicar.
April 1 <sup>st</sup>	Records of morning and afternoon temperatures, taken in each of the three classrooms, were forwarded to the education office today. In these records, taken since the beginning of term, there was nothing abnormal to report.
April 4 <sup>th</sup>	Miss Adlard, the LEA's physical education organiser, called this afternoon.
April 10 <sup>th</sup>	Miss Roberts was absent today owing to illness. School closed for the Easter holiday this afternoon. It will reopen on Tuesday 30th April.
April 30 <sup>th</sup>	The summer term commenced this morning. Attendance was very satisfactory. 3 infants and 2 juniors were admitted. Roll = 118. The instrument of management, No. 286, for the school was received from the ministry of education.

	<p>The school is now officially known as Welton St Mary's Primary School.</p> <p>The body of managers, now complete, consists of 4 foundation managers, namely Canon E.W Herbert (vicar of welton), Mrs E.Wright and Dr J.Y.G Malannahan (appointed by the Lincoln Diocesan board of education) and Mr R. Maw (appointed by the Welton Parochial church council) and 2 representative managers, namely: Mr C.W Taylor, appointed by Welton parish council, and Mr W Glew, appointed by the local education authority.</p>
May 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Library books from the county library were exchanged today.
May 7 <sup>th</sup>	Forwarded forms M.72 to the Director and District clerk.
May 13 <sup>th</sup>	<p>Mr Fletcher is absent today having received leave to attend Oxton Cofe school near Shrewsbury for interview for the post of Headmaster. He will also be absent tomorrow.</p> <p>After consulting the L.E.A the Headmaster secured the services of Mr H Bartlett, a qualified teacher residing in Welton, during the absence of Mr Fletcher. Mr Bartlett took charge of Mr Fletcher's class (lower junior A) and there was no serious alteration to the school timetable.</p>
May 15 <sup>th</sup>	Mr Fletcher returned to duty this morning and reported that he had been appointed Headmaster of Oxton Cofe school and will take up his new post at the beginning of the autumn term.
May 24 <sup>th</sup>	Empire day. School assembled at church this morning for a service at 9:15.
May 27 <sup>th</sup>	Notice on form SMS 40 of a case of measles in the infants department has been forwarded to the school medical officer.
May 29 <sup>th</sup> 1957	The school attendance officer called this afternoon.
May 30 <sup>th</sup>	Ascension day. School assembled at church for service this morning at 9:15.
June 3 <sup>rd</sup>	<p>The L.E.A's list of children to be transferred to secondary schools next September was received today.</p> <p>Graham Thomas, David Grayson and Anthony Dixon will attend the De aston school, Market Rasen.</p>
June 7 <sup>th</sup>	School closed for the Whitsun holiday this afternoon. It will re-open on Monday 17th June.
June 17 <sup>th</sup>	Re-opened school this morning.
May 31 <sup>st</sup>	Canon Ravins, Diocesan inspector of schools, conducted the annual inspection of religious knowledge this afternoon.
June 19 <sup>th</sup>	The headmaster was given leave of absence this afternoon to attend the graduation ceremony at Nottingham university. His son, John Charles Wakerley, who received his primary school education at Welton, received an Honours degree of bachelor of laws at the ceremony.
July 4 <sup>th</sup>	The annual school sports were held this evening in a field kindly lent by Mr. B Neave. Canon Herbert presented the "Rainthorpe" cup to the captains of Brinkhall house - the sports champions - and awards to Graham Thomas, Rosalind Thomas, John Fisher and Norma Piper as individual champions. It was a delightfully fine evening and a large number of parents and friends witnessed a very enjoyable programme of events.
July 10 <sup>th</sup>	The school competed in the inter school sports at Saxilby today and closed for the occasion.
July 19 <sup>th</sup>	<p>The following report was received today from Canon Ravins, Diocesan inspector following his visit on 31st May:</p> <p>It was a great pleasure to me to return to this school and see the high standard which it has maintained for so long, raised yet a little higher still. The inspection took place in the afternoon, but even that did not deter the children. Prayers were reverently and devoutly said, the assembly and preparation being both quick and quiet.</p> <p>The work accomplished and the standard attained is shown clearly in the fact that 16 first class certificates were .... by the school leavers for this term, out of</p>

	<p>which 8 received 90% marks and over and one - Graham Thomas - received 100%. Two others were awarded second class certificates.</p> <p>The other sections in the junior room wrote and illustrated O.T and N.T stories very well indeed. The suggested references in the Diocesan syllabus e.g. page 17, and others, should assist the children in correlating house, school, church and life altogether. Most schools have not attained a position where one can see the possibilities of this happening. In this school the idea is showing in the creation story, Samuel, Moses and several N.T stories of Jesus. The children showed in their work that the scene not only lived in their minds, but could also be applied to life today.</p> <p>The lower classes did some excellent work too. The infants were able to answer the simpler catechism questions and tell the meanings. The next class was really excellent and surprised me with the amount of work they had done, and remembered so well.</p> <p>The vicar, headmaster and staff as well as the scholars are to be congratulated upon their attainments, and deserve help and encouragement. One very great help would be the partitioning of the large room into two classrooms.</p> <p>Certificates - 1st class. Graham Thomas 100%, Christopher Sayers 91%, Raymond Meggitt 91%, David Grayson 91%, Anthony Dixon 87%, Anthony Johnson 86%, David Gwen 85%, Michael Adams 78%, Betty Jackson 95%, Judith Kent 93%, Sandra Butler 91%, Joan Starr 90%, Sheila Cammack 89%, Susan Jaremba 86%, Norma Fisher 85%, Patricia Bullen 78%.</p> <p>2nd class. Richard Neave 53%, Michael Ream 52%.</p> <p>Signed: L.A Ravons Diocesan inspector</p>
July 26 <sup>th</sup> 1957	<p>Before school closed this afternoon for the summer holiday all classes assembled in the large classroom.</p> <p>Mr N Wright, a manager of the school and donor of the "wright" house cup, presented the trophy to the captains of Brinkhall, the champion house.</p> <p>The "Fletcher" shield for physical education and games was presented to the captains of Rivehall.</p> <p>Canon Herbert, chairman of the managers, presented certificates awarded by the Diocesan board of education to the 18 children mentioned in the Diocesan inspector's report.</p> <p>On behalf of the managers, the staff and scholars the headmaster presented Mr Fletcher with a mantel chiming clock in appreciation of his services as assistant master during the past 5 years, and wished him success in his new post.</p> <p>After dismissal school closed until Tuesday, 10th September.</p>
Sept 10 <sup>th</sup>	<p>School re-opened this morning, 5 infants were admitted and the total on roll = 101.</p> <p>Mr Y.G Hullett commenced duty as temporary teacher. He will be with us for a fortnight only, until he returns to Leeds university to continue his studies.</p> <p>During the holidays the interior of the school was re-decorated. The conventional green and cream were discarded for contemporary colours each classroom having its own colour scheme.</p> <p>The new classrooms are arranged as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 33 upper juniors (ages 9-10) in the large classroom. Class teacher: the headmaster.</li> <li>2. 29 lower juniors (Group A ages 8-9) also in the large classroom. Temporary teacher: Mr Y.G Hullett.</li> <li>3. 17 lower juniors (Group B) in the middle classroom. Class teachers: Miss P.A Roberts.</li> <li>4. 22 infants in the infants classroom. Class teacher: Miss N Fox.</li> </ol> <p>The percentage attendance this morning was 98%.</p>

Sept 16 <sup>th</sup>	School attended church this morning at 9:15 for a special patronal festival service.
Sept 20 <sup>th</sup>	Mr Y.G Hullett terminated his duties as temporary teacher.
Sept 23 <sup>rd</sup>	Mrs A Salter commenced duties as temporary teacher, taking charge of the lower junior A class. The heating boiler in the main classroom has been found to be faulty and is being replaced by a new one. In the meantime, owing to cold weather, the room is heated by an electric fire and an oil stove - both kindly lent.
Sept 26 <sup>th</sup>	The children's harvest festival was held in church this morning when they brought gifts of fruit, vegetables and provisions (later sent to the Boy's Home, Lincoln). The service was conducted by the Vicar, Canon E.W Herbert, and the lesson was read by David Burden.
Oct 4 <sup>th</sup>	Several children have been absent this week, suffering from a very infectious type of influenza known as "asian flu". Average attendance for the week was 78%.

This is a frieze picture which is to illustrate the Church Year, and the completed portion (Annunciation to Epiphany) attains a high standard.</p>
119	<p>In both classes the children were alert and readily answered questions showing that the lessons given had "gone home" to them.</p> <p>In the Junior Department this work is continued with lessons on the Seasons, the Baptismal Covenant, the Creed and some simple outlines of Church history – in particular the coming of the Faith to England. Again, the children's attention is directed to the Parish Church and there is more detailed teaching on the uses of the various furnishings.</p> <p>Finally, in the top group, the main ideas of the duty of Churchmen to God and neighbour are taught together with lessons on Prayer, Sacraments and Worship.
