Dear Parents and Carers,


What a great start to our school year – a very special year for us as a school community. It is our school's 200<sup>th</sup> birthday where we are 'honouring the past, inspiring the present and shaping the future'. One of the highlights of the term has to be our Victorian Day. We combined the past and the present with children and staff either wearing clothes from today or clothes that would have been worn in 1826 when our school was founded. The children were welcomed to school by the old school bell and then experienced the day as a Victorian child in a Victorian classroom. By the end of the day there were many very grateful children who realised that school life today is so much better than it was in 1826!











The children had plenty to say about their experience. One Year 5 pupil remarked, "Victorian teachers were really horrific because of how strict they were!" Another added, "I'd love to do Victorian Day again because you got to experience what it was like instead of just being told."

Many children commented on preferring chalkboards to modern interactive whiteboards, appreciating the simplicity and novelty. The strict teaching style also sparked conversation, with several pupils noting how different it felt compared to their usual classroom environment.

Lunchtime brought even more joy, with traditional games like hopscotch and skipping proving to be a hit. Interestingly, quite a few children expressed a surprising fondness for the reduced use of technology and the more disciplined approach to learning.

As one child put it, "It is amazing to see how different it was to 2025." Overall, the day was not only a fun and engaging event but also a powerful learning experience that brought history to life.



















Whilst the way we teach and what we teach today is very different from when our school was founded, what we aim for is still the same – every child and adult who is part of our school community to have opportunities, hope, be cared for, able to learn and to thrive as an individual and part of the wider community. The headteacher wrote in their log book:

Aug 14<sup>th</sup> 1908- Closed the school today for Harvest Holidays for 5 weeks.

Aug 10<sup>th</sup> 1909 - Closed the schools today for the Harvest Holidays for four weeks. This year we are only having 4 weeks as the managers intend having a week later in the Potato picking season. Considering the wet weather the attendance has been most gratifying

Sept 16<sup>th</sup> 1912 - Commenced School after the Harvest Holidays. Several of the upper class children are absent assisting the farmers.

## **Bikeability**

Learning to ride a bike and riding safely is a life skill. Our Year 5 children have recently received lessons – you may have seen them out on the roads. It was great to see all children making good progress over the week. There were children who showed real pride in learning how to ride a bike and children who learnt more about being safe on the roads.

There are a lot of children coming to school on bikes. Please remember to wear a helmet if cycling to school.

### **Parking on School Drive**

Thank you to all the families who are now parking away from School Drive. Whilst there are still cars coming down School Drive at the start and end of the school day, there is less traffic.

A reminder that cars should not be parking in the **KEEP CLEAR** area outside the garages. There have been a few occasions recently when owners of the garages have not been able to gain access.

## Reminder about school uniform

Children are expected to wear black shoes during the school day (throughout the school year). Trainers are only to be worn at lunchtimes when on the field (and it is dry) and for PE.

#### Wellies and waterproofs

There is no such thing as bad weather .....

Children go outside at lunchtimes in all weathers to experience play. Part of our school uniform is wellies and waterproofs.

Please can you ensure children are sent to school with a named waterproof coat every day as all children will be going outside.

Please can you label all clothing. This term we have seen a significant increase in the number of unnamed jumpers and other items of clothing. You may have seen the lost property box outside school. We have not had to have a lost property box in recent years. One of our values is responsibility. We are encouraging the children to be responsible for their belongings - either wearing their jumpers or them being in their locker, but it really does help to return items to children when they are names.

#### **Jewellery**

Children are able to wear a watch and stud earrings. No other jewellery is allowed in school. Earrings **MUST** be taken out for PE unless ears have been newly pierced. If your child cannot take their own earrings out, we ask that they are not worn on PE days.


Ygam continues to offer free awareness sessions for parents and carers, and training sessions for professionals working with young people, to help explore the links between gaming and gambling harms.

### **Free School Meal Application**

As you may be aware, all children in Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 in England's state-funded schools receive a free meal under the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) policy.

If you have a child in Foundation Stage, Year 1 or Year 2 we urge you to apply for Free School Meals (FSM) even though you automatically receive UIFSM if you think that you are eligible. If you are successful in your application this will provide additional funding for school as well as vital benefits to your family.

If your child is in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 UIFSM no longer applies. If you feel you may benefit from Free School Meals (FSM) please ensure you apply (click here). If you are not eligible for free school meals you can purchase a hot meal each day at a cost of £2.50. Meals can be ordered through Good Lookin Cookin.

#### Qualifying for FSM means you could benefit from:

- The Holiday Activities and Food programme. HAF provides free holiday clubs during Easter, Summer and Christmas for Reception to Year 11 (click here)
- Reduced costs (50% discount) for school trips (including residentials), workshops and one paid-for afterschool club per term
- Free school meals from Year 3 onwards

If you would like any support with making an application, please do come into school and we can help.

#### **Operation Encompass**

We are an **Operation Encompass School**, part of a national scheme that runs jointly between all schools and the police.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced, any domestic abuse.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school's staff (the Designated Safeguarding Lead), is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have recently experienced a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
