Mobile phones

The DFE has provided guidance for all schools on mobile phones. We are currently writing a mobile phone policy which will be in place for September 2025.

In the meantime children are not permitted to bring mobile phones to school. We are actively discouraging children in using them on the way to school. We have been made aware of children using their phone on the way to school – this is not safe as they should be focussing on the present and their safety on their walk to school, not accessing their phone. There have also been occasions of inappropriate / unkind messaging on the way to and from school. This is not acceptable. Everyone needs to feel safe on their way to and from school.

In exceptional circumstances there may be a need for a child to be bringing a phone to school as a one off. In this case, an email from a parent is required beforehand and the phone must be handed in at the office on arrival at school.

School Uniform

Our children wear their school uniform with pride and it gives a sense of belonging to our school.

Every school is required to have a school uniform policy. <u>Click here</u> for our policy. Please refer to this when purchasing new uniform items.

Branded items are not part of our school PE uniform and therefore are not to be worn. We have introduced a PE hoodie that is available at Uniform Direct. This is not compulsory – if not worn, then the alternative is a plain (non-branded) navy hoodie. In our school uniform policy we have also added wellies and a waterproof coat / bottoms as, with the introduction of OPAL, children will be going outside whatever the weather.

Just a few reminders:

- *Jewellery small stud earrings can be worn (one in each ear). Children are expected to take their earrings out for PE and not put tape over them (unless the ears are newly pierced in which case tape can be worn for the 6 weeks). This is for their safety. Children will either need to be able to take their earrings out themselves or not wear earrings on PE days. Children can wear a watch (but no smartwatches). Children should not be wearing any other jewellery. Nail varnish is not allowed.
- *Hair Children are permitted to wear plain blue, black, brown, white bobbles or hair bands. Hair accessories are to be kept small and to a minimum
- *Black school shoes are in our uniform policy. Trainers should not be worn in school other than for PE.
- *School skirts should be of an appropriate style and length for a school setting. Skirts should be tailored or pleated and fall to around the knee. Tube skirts, stretch fabric skirts, and those that are very short are not suitable for school and should not be worn.
- *PE shorts There are some children wearing very 'short' shorts which are not appropriate. PE shorts should be

Moving to new classes

Each year the children get the opportunity to meet their new teacher and children who will be in their class. This year this will be taking place on July 2nd. The children will find out that morning who their teacher will be for next year and will spend time with them starting to build relationships and getting to know a little bit about the exciting things they will be learning about next year. Before the end of the school day, you will receive an email sharing which teachers are working in each year group so that you are able to have a conversation with your child when they come out of school. We ask that you talk positively with your child about moving up day, both in preparation for the day and when your child comes home and talk with them about the opportunities that there are in their new class with their new teacher.

Each year we carefully consider which classes to mix. It is a great opportunity for children to mix with up to 60 children during their time at our school, getting to know, and work with, different children and personalities. This is also great for character-building and developing both resilience and social skills. A lot of time and several conversations are had when organising classes. Ultimately the final decisions are made by the leadership team.

This year we have decided to create new classes for children who are in:

Foundation Stage moving into Year 1

Year 2 moving into Year 3

Year 4 moving into Year 5

They are reminded to leave them in their lockers however we do find that jumpers are left on the field. Many of these are not named.
