The ABC Checklist - Online Safety

With Christmas just around the corner, the holiday period is a great time to take stock of the devices they have (plus any new Xmas devices) and ensure they are set up correctly with any parental features you feel are appropriate for your child. One frustrating issue is that the available features and how you set devices up differ, so to help parents Internet Matters have really good, non-techie guides which you can follow as part of their ABC Checklist. ABC stands for:

- A Activate parental controls.
- B Balance screen time.
- C Check and chat.

Christmas Presence

We have an idea of Christmas (peace, chill, relax, sleep), and then the actual reality of the thing (buying, wrapping, making, visiting).

At its core, Christmas is about connection. Connection with friends, family and – often overlooked – connection with the present moment.

That last one is elusive. 'Right now' is such a slippery customer!

We might be sitting at the table tucking into our turkey but mentally we are already worrying about the next thing that needs doing. We might be watching our children dive into their prezzies but our minds are on a work email that came in the day before. At a family party, we might find ourselves peeping at our phones checking what other people are doing instead of checking in with the people in front of us.

The most important choice we have is what we give our attention to. It is our most prized resource.

Being completely present costs nothing but means everything. It means being in the room, not just physically but mentally and emotionally as well. It means bringing your WHOLE self to the moment. It means putting your phone away, turning off your mental checklist, and tuning in to those in front of you. It means existing in the moment instead of dwelling on the past or worrying about the future.

Because, plot spoiler: Now is happening NOW!

My top tip is to be intentionally present this Christmas. Instead of rushing through the festivities, savour the moments. Be there, fully. Be present in your presence.

So, however you celebrate this Christmas, give yourself and your loved ones the greatest gift of all: your presence.

Operation Encompass

We are an **Operation Encompass School**, part of a national scheme that runs jointly between all schools and the police. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced, any domestic abuse.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school's staff (the Designated Safeguarding Lead), is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have recently experienced a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved. This information shared with the school is already covered in the schools' existing privacy notice. Seasonal Illnesses and Keeping Healthy

As expected in the winter months, seasonal illnesses are circulating. The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has published advice on how to reduce the spread of seasonal illness and we would like to support you with a few tips to ensure your child is still able to access the schooling there are entitled to. As a school, we would like to see 95% attendance in







cold or wet. This is not a good enough reason to keep your child at home. We have had far too many late children so far this year and we need to reduce this to ensure that their education does not suffer. The School gates open at 8.45am, using the one-way system, children can be dropped at their classrooms from 8.50am. Registration is at 9.00am. Children arriving after 9.00am are required to come into school via the school office. This is so we can mark them as being present in the building and ensure that they are accounted for in the

line with the Local Authority expectations. There is a noticeable increase in absence when the weather is

Children should attend school every day unless they really are too ill. If they are ill, please take them to the doctor's and bring in proof if you can. Try and arrange any appointments outside of school hours. If children are unwell in school then we will call parents and ask them to bring medication in the first instance. If they do not improve, we then may send children home. Please ensure we have your up to date phone numbers to ensure that we can reach you if needed.

For further information on some of the most common conditions and illnesses, parents can refer to NHS guidance to know when a child is too ill for school. Pupils should not miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend school with a cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea and vomiting.























Tips for keeping healthy:

Teach children good hand washing habits and make sure they are washing their hands often. Make hand sanitiser available and use it when you are on the go.

- Wet your hands with clean water.
- Lather palms, fingers, nails and backs of your hands with soap.
- Scrub for at least 20 seconds.
- Rinse your hands with clean water.
- Dry your hands thoroughly with a clean paper towel
- 2. <u>Use proper technique when sneezing or coughing</u>. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or your elbow when you sneeze.
- 3. Teach your children to give personal space to other children who are sick. This doesn't mean to ignore them, but to avoid body contact and minimize handling items the sick child has been using, such as toys, books or markers.
- 4. Get plenty of exercise. Exercise boosts the immune system and helps our bodies
