

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

Towards the end of last year the children had their views and thoughts heard for the new Welton Neighbourhood plan. We have continued our involvement with the local community, visiting the Care Apartments and Bungalows that are being built by RG Carter. The School Council and House Captains asked some excellent questions about the apartments, how they were inclusive and what facilities would be available to the residents. We are looking forward to visiting again once the walls have been plastered and then to see the finished 'village within a village'.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> February 2024, School Council and the House Captains visited the local care home, which is currently being built on the edge of Welton. The builders showed us different working machines including a crane and a forklift. They also let us explore the building and showed us multiple rooms and told us what they were going to be. School Council and House Captains are very excited to visit the building again and see how it has developed.

## **Start and End of School**

The school gates will be open at 8.45am for a 9.00am start (where all children are expected to be in their classrooms prepared for the day) and will then be open again at 3.25pm for a 3.30pm finish. To keep the children safe we have a one way system around school. As you will appreciate, the beginning of the school day is a very busy time. If you have a message regarding the need to pick your child up during the school day, please can you ring the school office and they will inform the class teacher. If there is a change from the usual adults collecting, please ring the school to let them know. There are occasions when parents/carers are late picking up their children. Whilst we appreciate that in some emergency circumstances, this cannot be helped, we cannot provide childcare after school. We have therefore worked with Kids Club to provide suitable childcare arrangements should the adult be late collecting your children. After 3.40pm your children will go to Kids Club until they are collected. School will contact parents to inform them that their child is in childcare and that parent's emergency contact details have been passed to Kids Club. Using Kids Club will incur a childcare cost to parents for the session which will need to be paid directly to Premier Education. If you are calling to speak with a specific member of staff your call will be returned within 24hrs, this may not be the same day.



### **House Captains**

Throughout this year, our 12 House Captains have been getting up to a lot of new and exciting experiences, leading the school in many different ways. Some of these experiences include:

- \*Leading the Above and Beyond Award (this celebrates the children who have been selected by their teachers for going above and beyond all term by receiving a little treat)
- \*Collecting and counting the house points and sharing the results with the school
- \*Leading a Collective Worship about bullying to further raise awareness of this important issue
- \*Supporting the younger children at the KS1 disco
- \*Leading tours for visitors
- \*Supporting the younger children in the hall at dinnertime
- \*Helping the Key Stage One children find their way over to St Mary's Church.

We also enjoyed a very different experience which was visiting a local building site where there will soon be elderly people living to track its progress and build links with the developers and residents in the future. We helped to lead a house meeting in term 2 where the children in their houses created a piece of artwork to represent our school vision. A group of children in years 4 to 6 then worked with some brilliant Year 12 art students to develop one single design. which has since been further developed by a professional illustrator. We are delighted to reveal that this creative and visual display of our school vision will be up on the outdoor wall by the big hall for all to see at the start of term 5. We can't wait for you all to see it and see where you can spot our school vision. In addition to this, some of the House Captains have introduced a drama club for some KS2 children to participate in and enjoy on a Thursday lunchtime. The interest was huge and therefore we have had to limit the numbers this term and ensure that all children get the opportunity over the next 3 terms.

Overall, the House Captains have had an eventful year so far and we look forward to helping to drive the school forward further in the coming weeks. We will be looking to lead a house event soon (which looks like it could be an exciting TT Rockstars battle of the houses!)
