HAF E-voucher Allocations

The Local Authority continuously monitors and reviews the use and impact of the HAF programme in Lincolnshire. This helps us to support schools and other providers that may require guidance on the most effective way to target their current cohort of disadvantaged children.

Holiday Activity Food vouchers are auto allocated to benefits-related Free School Meal pupils. If you feel you might qualify you can apply at [Apply for free school meals – Lincolnshire County Council](#)

As a school we use the following characteristics in deciding which students should benefit from the extra 10% E-vouchers, this is additional to the Holiday Activity Food vouchers that are allocated to benefits-related Free School Meals and are pupils who are not in receipt of benefits-related FSM but who the school believe could benefit from Holiday Activity Food Program.

We consider the following characteristics in order:

- Children being supported by targeted services (child in need, child protection or TAC)
- Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities
- Young carers
- Children in care
- Children being supported by targeted Pastoral support (Attendance / Early Help)
- Children with low school attendance or at risk of low attendance (85% or below)
- Children in Reception at risk of low attendance.
- Ukrainian and Afghanistan refugees

Each child will be considered individually.

Please note that:

- attendance data will be considered against each of the groups ranking higher than attendance
- children who have multiple of the listed characteristics will be considered first.
